Sunday school seminars

Sunday school curricula

Churches are again reminded that the Education Committee of the Board of Church Ministries encourages using Anabaptist materials or, at least, the supplementing of interdenominational materials. Anabaptist materials are available through Mennonite Publishing Network, Kindred Press (check the Word Wise and Luminaire Studies produced by the Mennonite Brethren), and Steinbach Bible College (five sets of study and leader's guides are available from the college). SBC's titles are Radical Discipleship, Come Let Us Worship, The Last Trumpet, Minor Prophets, and Living Truth.

Check out the **brochure** on *Gather 'Round*, a curriculum for children, youth and adults, put out by Mennonite Church Canada, Mennonite Church USA, and Church of the Brethren (www.gatherround.org).

Discussing Anabaptist theology

The Evangelical Anabaptist Committee will **present some findings** in July 2006, with likely further information to come in December. The committee serves under authority of the BCM and the Board of Leadership and Outreach. Pastor Kenton Penner (Treesbank) is the committee's chairperson (204-824-2268).

Follow Me sample

BCM's Education Committee, with the support of the Social Concerns Committee (Board of Leadership and Outreach), has published a 13-lesson discussion guide. A sample is included to each EMC church (a few have been distributed already). The booklet will serve our congregations through study by cell groups, senior youth groups, older teen/adult Sunday school classes, as a pastoral

preaching aid, and in other ways. While there is no leader's guide, discussion questions are scattered within the lessons and there is a list of resources in the back.

The booklet's **cost is subsidized** to keep it at \$2.50 for EMCers. For non-EMCers it is \$4.50. Shipping is extra. There were 16 writers, 15 with EMC connections. The Board of Church Ministries strongly encourages *all* EMC churches to use this resource.

While our conference is too small to develop a Sunday school curriculum yearly for a range of ages, we can produce occasional, helpful materials. By using what we have, it's more likely that others will be produced.


Worship/Music Committee

New DVDs at national office

- Can't, Not Won't: A Christian Response to Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder, MCC, 45 minutes, discussion guide (DVD and VHS).
- Shadow Voices: Finding Hope in Mental Illness (A documentary on stigma, recovery, and hope) Mennonite Media, 58 minutes, discussion guide (DVD).

MCC Canada has, sadly, closed its national Mental Health and Disabilities Program (where EMCer Irma Janzen was staff person). Some provincial MCCs continue with their programs. Issues surrounding mental health and disabilities often fade into the background, and MCC Canada's move doesn't help to reverse this. Pastors and other educators are **encouraged to continue to respond** to these issues within our faith communities. (For two



years I served with MCC Manitoba as a resource person in the area of physical disabilities.)
